- Pregnancy.
- D.M
- Previous UTI.
- FC
- Stone
- GU malignancy.
- Obstruction.
- Voiding dysfunction.
- Institutionalized elderly

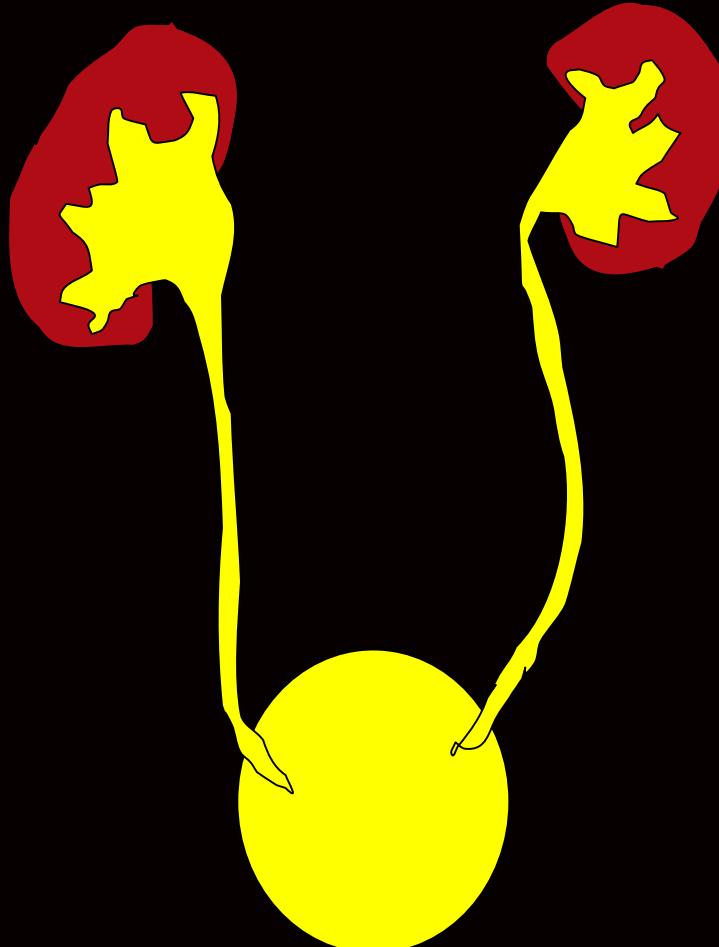

- Reflux
